As co-educators the school will:

1. Model the school's core values and support the school's ethos and policies at all times. This includes having high expectations for behaviour and learning, providing challenge and support to all children to help them achieve.
2. Ensure your child's physical, social and emotional wellbeing at all times, and help foster feelings of confidence, self-worth and belonging.
3. Deliver a balanced and carefully planned curriculum that meets the needs of your child and encourages them to actively participate.
4. Actively welcome parents/carers into the school to broaden learning opportunities for the children.
5. Keep you informed of your child's progress and general school matters.
6. Value and build on learning at home in lessons.
7. Ensure that all home learning is given regularly on an agreed day, and support you and your child if needed.
8. Create a safe and stimulating environment that promotes independence and allows the development of life skills.
9. Ensure that teaching staff are available at appropriate times to discuss any concerns you might have about your child's progress or general welfare.
10. Share school policies and guidelines on behaviour with parents to ensure consistency at school and home.
11. Provide a range of extra-curricular activities which are designed to enrich your child's learning experiences.

As a co-educator I will value and take an active role in my child's learning by:

1. Supporting the school's core values, ethos, policies and behavioural procedures, including e-safety guidelines.
2. Being a positive role model for behaviour and learning on the school grounds and community.
 - Parents should speak to staff and other parents with respect and courtesy; likewise staff to parents.
 - Parents are expected to supervise their children closely at the start and end of each day.
 - Parents should speak to all children with respect and consideration.
3. Ensuring that my child attends school every day and on time arriving before 8:45am.
4. Sharing responsibility for my child's learning by talking with their class teacher about ways to support learning at home, questions and any worries.
5. Attending Parents' Meetings and discussing my child's progress at home and school.
6. Ensuring my child reads at home daily and records appropriately in their reading journal, taking it to and from school every day.
7. Supporting my child with their home learning, ensuring it is completed to a high standard to foster pride and a sense of achievement.
8. Ensuring my child adheres to the school's uniform policy, including P.E. kit, and that all uniform is permanently labelled.
9. Making sure my child is ready for learning by ensuring they have a good night's sleep, eat breakfast and are hydrated.
10. Promoting opportunities for learning and using skills outside of school, i.e. playing board games.
